In Sladen's absence, your letter of the 28th September with regard to the case of Mr. A.J.P. Walter has come to me. I find from our file that Mr. Walter's original letter forwarding an application form for the post as Assistant Government Geologist in Tanganyika, dated 11th May, was received at Government House on the 14th. On the 15th May a copy of his letter with enclosures was sent to the Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs asking that arrangements might be made for a personal interview with Mr. Walter, by a responsible person who could vouch for his fitness. This is in accordance with the instructions we have received from the Private Secretary, Appointments.
