

HOGS AND SHEEP LOWER IN MONTREAL

But Cattle Held Firm—Owing to Reduced Supplies—Demand Continues Small.

MONTREAL, Jan. 27.—At the Montreal Stock Market, the week ending Jan. 26 was a quiet one, with the offerings this morning were 900 cattle, 100 sheep and lambs, 300 hogs and 300 calves.

Owing to the large supplies of cattle lately, shipments were reduced, and a firm feeling prevailed. Demand was somewhat limited, owing to the fact that butchers and packers were well stocked, but on the whole a fair trade was done at \$7.10 to \$7.15, but the bulk of the trade was done at \$6.50 to \$6.75 per cwt. There was no demand from packers for full car loads, consequently the trade was principally of a jobbing character.

An order feeling developed in the market for sheep and lambs and prices declined. The offerings were small, but as the demand was limited, they were ample to fill all requirements. Good stocks of grain and lambs were on hand, which were in demand.

The demand for calves was fair and prices ruled steady. Few small lots of sheep were offered, but ample to fill the demand. Selected lots brought \$7.50 to \$8.00 per cwt., weighed out.

Butchers' choice, \$6.50 to \$7.00; medium, \$6.00 to \$6.50; common, \$5.50 to \$6.00; cull, \$5.00 to \$5.50; hogs, \$5.00 to \$5.50; sheep, \$5.00 to \$5.50; lambs, \$5.00 to \$5.50; calves, \$5.00 to \$5.50.

Union Stock Yards. At noon on Monday there were 53 car loads of live stock at the City Cattle Market, comprising 120 cattle and 40 calves.
