Season Opens the Middle of April—Games Conflict Only in Chicago.

NEW YORK, Feb. 3.—For five hours today, President Ban Johnson and the baseball club owners held whispered conversations in the corridors of the hotel, but none of them was admitted to the American League meeting. It was expected that some definite action would be taken by the major league today in reference to the removal of the draft rule from the class A.A. league clubs of the National Association. President Johnson's secretary announced, however, that it was unanimously agreed to leave the question of abolition of the draft rule to the National Commission, which will be held at either Chicago or Cincinnati next Saturday.

No change was made in the player limit of 25 now in force in the American League, although the National League has reduced the number from 25 to 21 players. All the clubs were represented at the meeting. Most of the club owners left for their homes tonight. President Johnson will stay over until tomorrow, when he will leave to attend a meeting of the National Commission, which will be held at either Chicago or Cincinnati next Saturday.
