A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of the three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction the case of rough scruptly constitutions. reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substi-tuted for cultivation under certain con-
