enabled to put an end to this unnatural war in America, and fecure to himfelf the quiet poffeffion of his crown and dominions, if this is brought about before France should take advantages of the diffracted fituation we are in, through all his majefty's dominions belonging to the British empire. I shall add an advice to his majesty. from the fincerity of my heart, let him look upon any man, w':o shall advise him to establish arbitrary power in any part of his dominions, as an enemy to his family-the protection of liberty and our prefent happy conflictution is the foundation of the rights upon which the prefent royal family is founded : and if he would add to this, to leparate his foreign dominions from those of any king of Britain after him, and give them to a feparate branch of his family, it would make him the most popular king that ever was in England, and would deprive at once the Pretender, and his next heirs, of all arguments in their favour, from the inconveniences that must arife by involving Great-Britain in wars on the continent, in defence of those dominions. Lam aware of what I have heard from those who call themfelves the king's friends, that this cannot be done by the laws of the empire; but as I have been
