An Act to incorporate "The St. Patrick's Literary Institute of Quebec."

WHEREAS an institute called the "St. Patrick's Catholic and Literary Institute" has been in existence in the City of Quebec, for over twenty-two years;

And whereas it is expedient to accede to the prayer of the members thereof, asking that it be incorporated under the name of "The St. Patrick's Literary Institute;" Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature of Quebec, enacts as follows:

Quinn, James Rafferty, John Roche, Matthew F. Walsh, John O'Leary, Patrick Shee, Mark McLaughlin, William Maguire, M. D., and such other persons as now are, or may be hereafter associated with them in conformity with this act, and their successors, are hereby constituted and created a body corporate and politic, with all the rights incident to corporations, by the name of "The St. Patrick's Literary Institute" for the purposes of education and for the advancement of the sciences and literature.

2. Within six months of the coming into force of this act, the said corporation shall be bound to make an inventory by notary of all the property now belonging to it, valuing movables and immovables, and any of the present members wishing to withdraw from the said corporation shall have the right to do so and claim their share of the net property of the said corporation; this intention to withdraw and claim their share shall be made in writing within six months after the completion of the aforesaid inventory.

2. The said corporation shall have perpetual succession, and may have a common seal, with power to change, alter, break and renew the same, when and as often as they shall think proper, and may, under the said name, contract and be contracted with, sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, prosecute and be prosecuted in all courts and places whatsoever in this province; and by the same name, they and their successors, from time to time, and at
