

LAKE LEVEL HAS GONE UP UNUSUAL FOR THIS SEASON

MASKED MEN OVERPOWER WATCHMAN AND GET PLUNDER. Kennebunk, Maine, July 16.—Five armed and masked men overpowered and bound the night watchman and another employe at the Kennebunk Railroad here early to-day, took several hundred dollars from the unlocked safe and escaped untraced.

CHICAGO, July 16.—Edward F. Kloss and his wife, who conducted a small millinery store on North-avenue were found dead to-day in their rooms above the store. Their throats had been cut and their bodies had been shot thru the head.

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HIS RESEMBLANCE FATAL

General Kozlov Slain in Mistake for the Hated Trepoft.

St. Petersburg, July 16.—Additional details of the assassination of General Kozlov of the headquarters staff in the park at Peterhof on Saturday, prove beyond question that the murderer believed he was killing General Trepoft.

The tragedy occurred at 9:30 in the evening in the presence of several thousand people who were listening to the music in the English Park, before the Grand Chateau, adjoining the Imperial family and Gen. Trepoft residence.

The man then drew a pistol and fired four shots point blank at Kozlov, who fell mortally wounded and expired on the spot. The assassin started to flee, but Prince Andromitoff seized him and turned him over to the police.

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MRS. THAW VISITS SON NO GREETING FOR HIS WIFE

Mother of Prisoner Goes to Tombs —Prison Rules Are Enforced.

New York, July 16.—Mrs. William Thaw of Pittsburg paid a visit to her son, Harry K. Thaw, in the Tombs prison to-day. She was accompanied by her son Josiah C. Thaw, and by A. R. Penobly of Harry Thaw's counsel.

The mother reached the prison shortly before noon. When her car stopped at the door the bystanders pressed forward to see the prisoner's mother.
