

A local cash house wired St. Louis offering the very best No. 2 red wheat put down there at 95c. The wheat was not wanted. A leading house sent out the statement that St. Louis will supply bad crop news until the leaders there can find a good spot to sell the wheat already bought in this market. With the southwest news discredited in this way there was little to add force to the trade. The warmer weather with local rains was against the market. It is understood that crop experts like Ingalis declare that all guesses on the crop until after warm rains are not worth the paper on which they are written.
