Navigation Not Open

Ice Does Not Permit Entrance Into Harbor of Montreal.

Montreal, April 25.—The first sailing from the port of Montreal was announced to take place to-day, but the ice did not permit it. The honor of the first sailing was to have gone to the steamer Campana of the Quebec Steamship Company. The announcement made at the company's offices to-day was that the steamer was still tied up in the harbor at Quebec waiting to get thru to Montreal. They now entertain little hope of getting the steamer off by Monday next. The Thompson Line steamers Ionia and Fremont, the Donaldson Line Savaria, the Canadian Pacific Atlantic Steamship Company's steamer Lake Champlain, and the Dominion Line steamship Dominion, are all due by the end of the week, but it is now regarded as almost certain that all the steamers will be forced to remain in Quebec for a couple of days. If necessary the steamers will unload at Montreal, and then if the ice has moved out come up to this port for their outward cargo. The first steamer of the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company to reach port this year came up from Sorel this morning.

MULQUEEN'S COMPROMISE

BUT CAN MOVE IF HE WISHES

Hotelkeeper Makes Copland Co. an Offer While Commissioners Accord to His Plans.

The trouble over the purchase of the property known as the Cameron House by the Copland Brewing Company, over the head of P. J. Mulqueen, the present occupant, reached the board of license commissioners at a special meeting last night. Mr. Mulqueen was accompanied by his solicitor, E. J. Malone. The Copland Company was represented by Adam W. Ballantyne, of Jutiche, Ludwig & Ballantyne, who is also one of the directors of the brewing company.

Hotelkeeper Makes Copland Co. an Offer While Commissioners Accord to His Plans.

Before the commissioners arrived, the opposing factions had a heart to heart conference. It is understood that Mr. Mulqueen offered to pay the Copland company the same price for the property that they had purchased it for, and would further pay for a new hotel, worth \$15,000 worth of his goods annually. Heretofore Mulqueen has been a free lance in plans for a new hotel, but he has given his trade to whom he pleased. It is owing to this fact, it is claimed, that the Copland Company purchased the premises, so that they would be in a position to control the place and furnish the beer, ale and porter sold there by the new hotel.
