PROF. McLEOD RETICENT STEPHENS' BAD MEMORY

J. M. Shanley Speaks a Word in Favor of Canadian Engineers.

Montreal, July 4.—(Special)—Judge Winchester opened his court here today, J. M. Shanley, C.E., being the first witness. At the enquiry in Montreal J. M. Shanley had stated that he had made application for American engineers only after he had exhausted every effort to obtain Canadian engineers and Mr. Mowat produced this testimony and asked Mr. Shanley what he thought of the experience of certain men whom he named.

The witness' opinion, first, that Canadian engineers in sufficient numbers could be obtained second, that the qualifications of the Canadian engineers would compare favorably with those from the United States; and third, that as a member of the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers he had never heard that Mr. Stephens had made any application to that society for men.

Mr. Shanley, shown a list of men who had applied for work, recognized many of them as being applied qualified for the position of divisional or district engineer, which is now filled by Mr. Stephens, an American, at a salary of \$700 per annum. He mentioned the names of the following who would be in his opinion amply qualified for the premier position: Messrs. Massey, Doucet, Mountain, Leonard, Jennings, Lumsden. Mr. Shanley named 15 men who, from his knowledge, would be amply qualified for the position of divisional engineer, which position was worth \$400 per annum.

The next witness was Prof. McLeod of McGill University, who proved, as both Mr. Mowat and the court averred, an unwilling witness. Prof. McLeod refused to answer most of the questions put to him by Mr. Mowat. He declined to mention the names of any members of the Society of Canadian Civil Engineers, which he was secretary, as being qualified for any position, whether that of chief, or divisional, or district engineer. He declined to say how many names on the list of membership might possibly have proper qualifications. He refused, again and again to say whether the number out of two thousand members might be one hundred or twenty-five or ten who would possess sufficient qualifications.

He was shown a list of men who had applied to the Grand Trunk, and he said he could not tell whether they were qualified or not. He said this, as Mr. Mowat reminded him, without having looked over the complete list. The professor, when asked why he had not been an employee of the Grand Trunk as an official timekeeper.

In the afternoon, witness Stephens was called. Witness refused to state if he had been in the Jamieson road, and he also refused to state why he had left South Africa and his memory failed him entirely when asked the names of the men to whom he had refused positions in the survey.

C. M. Hays was then asked from what source he had received a list of names to the government as to the men's nationality, and the general manager replied from Mr. Stephens.

Board of Health Discusses Plans for Doing Away With Noxious Odors.

Hamilton, July 4.—A fire caused by a defective fuse broke out in the home of T. J. Holden at 711, Hurontario street, at 435 Mary-street, this afternoon and did damage to the extent of \$200 to the house; the loss on the furniture is small. The blaze was confined to the kitchen and the bathroom above it.

This evening the members of the board of health discussed plans for doing away with bad odors that come from the coal oil inlet and almost stifle the passengers on the railway. The effluent of the sewage disposal works contains a large amount of ammonia and a sample from the inlet will be chemically analyzed, and if the chemist says that it would do any good the effluent will be turned into the inlet instead of the bay.

Harry Hobbs Goes Free BANK DIDN'T PROSECUTE

Crown Attorney Ball Promises to Bring Matter to Attention of Hon. Mr. Gibson.

Woodstock, July 4.—In the police court this forenoon Harry H. Hobbs, the insolvent bank teller who was arrested last week, received his trial on the charge of stealing the sum of \$72,341 from the Merchants Bank. He pleaded not guilty to the charge and the prosecutor offering no evidence against him he was discharged.

LAKE AND RAIL TRAFFIC BOTH OF HOLIDAY DEGREE

Big Crowd of Visitors Spent "4th" Here—Railway Accommodation at Station Inadequate.

Independence Day brought many hundreds of United States visitors into the city yesterday. At least 1500 arrived via the Niagara Navigation Company's boats, while the Lakeside and Garden City had their quota. The influx of visitors from the other side by rail was also a marked feature at the Union Station, helping to swell the heavy in-traffic which always marks the last day of this holiday season.
