FULLY A THOUSAND PERSONS PERISHED BY TERRIBLE TYPHOON AT HONG KONG Couple Found Lifeless After Their

Financial Loss Estimated at Several Millions of Dollars—Great Fleet of Vessels Sunk—Many Buildings Wrecked—Shipping Trade Paralyzed.

Manila, Sept. 19. - 3 p.m. - The latest advices from Hong Kong state that one thousand lives were lost during the typhoon ,and that the damage to property, public and private, will amount to millions of dollars.

Twelve ships were sunk, 24 were ed through lack of lighters.
