

ing and frequent X - ray exposure which seems to be productive to these growths merely makes way for them.

Dr. Peyton Rons and other investigators at the Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research, announced some time ago that the juices and fluids of cancers or sarcomata, when filtered under pressure, retained the power to infect healthy tissues with malignant tumor growths. Despite this and other undisputed facts of like nature, many continue to pronounce cancers as non-infectious. They blame it, or at least try to do so by inference, upon heredity a scapegoat almost as uncanny inervousness and imagination.

Experiments With Warts.

Wile and L. B. Kingery of the University of Michigan, have evidence to show that warts injected into healthy flesh are capable of infecting it with their kind. 


