Silver/ Mines in Saxony Go Down to 1000 Feet Depth.

The Montreal Herald says: The general belief of foreign engineers is that the Cobalt mines are destined for years of profitable working. A German mining engineer who was lately at Cobalt compares that district with a number of silver-cobalt mines with a number of silver-cobalt mines in Saxony, a district in which this engineer lived for many years. The silver-cobalt mines of Saxony were opened in 1470. By 1492 there were 182 producing mines. The largest was the St. George, which in 1534 produced a freakish mass of silver-cobalt that weighed 22 tons.
