Weddall & Son, \$175 to \$423, Scott Lumber Co, from \$281 to \$364, John G. Murchie from \$467 to \$165 to \$430 and Fredericton Gas Co. from \$467 to \$564.

The rate of taxation is \$1.41 per one hundred and the poll tax is \$5.


