More Ante-Season Games Than Ever

Baseball Teams of American and National Leagues Will Clash in Many Contests

New York, Feb. 20.—Although considerable opposition developed last spring among certain of the big league owners against the playing of ante-season inter-league games, the agitation appears to have had little effect, for more contests than this class have been scheduled for the next two months than was the case in 1916. A year ago the various clubs of the two major leagues met in more than thirty of these training season games, while close to fifty have already been announced for the coming campaign, with several clubs yet to make public their plans in this direction.

As a preliminary to the permanent races of last year the big circuit teams met in thirty-nine games, either inter-league or inter-club, with the result that the National League clubs won twenty-four and the American League clubs fifteen. The senior organization piled up a total of 309 hits and 154 runs to the junior's 290 hits and 125 runs. In errors the American League players made a slightly better showing, the final analysis crediting sixty-one to the Nationals and fifty-eight to the Americans.

This year forty-nine inter-league games have been scheduled to date, with Brooklyn in the National and Boston and New York in the American League playing the greatest number of contests. The New York Giants and the Boston Braves are second in the National, while Detroit holds a similar position in the American League.

Lajoie Will Play 1st Base.

New York, Feb. 21.—Napoleon Lajoie, who will manage the Toronto International League club this year, will not be forgotten by the American League, to which he played for many years.

President Johnson informed Lajoie yesterday that he had arranged with the Toronto club for a special day on which to honor the big Frenchman. One of the American League teams will play an exhibition game with the Torontos on that occasion and Lajoie will receive a handsome present from the club owners in Johnson's circuit in recognition of his past services.

Lajoie wound up his major league career last fall playing twenty-one consecutive years in fast company. The big fellow intends to cover first base for the Toronto team this season. His engagement has aroused much interest among Canadian baseball fans.
