WHY GERMANS DESIRE TO DESTROY THE SUEZ CANAL

By Forcing Vessels to Resume Old
Route Teutons Believe They
Could Affect Commerce

Commenting on the alleged aim of the
Teutons and the Turks to seize the Suez
Canal the Paris Temps says:

"If the Suez Canal should fall into
the hands of the Turks and Germans all
transit obviously would be forbidden
English vessels, which, in order to main-
tain Great Britain's communications with
India and the Far East would have to
resume Vasco da Gama's old trade
route around the Cape of Good Hope.
But that route is in no way adapted to
accommodate the traffic of a great mer-
chant fleet. The opportunities for re-
plenishing a vessel's coal bunkers are
scarce because the distance between the
various supply depots are great. While
in the Mediterranean and the Red Sea
there are well supplied coaling stations
at frequent intervals, it takes a voyage
of fifteen or twenty days between sta-
tions on the eastern Atlantic coast and
in the Indian ocean. Besides, these lat-
ter depots have only a small reserve of
coal, which if many merchant vessels
should suddenly make demand would
soon give out.

"As every one knows, the Suez Canal
has shortened the route from Europe to
India and the Far East by from eighteen
to thirty days, depending on the ports of
departure and destination. On the old
route around the Cape of Good Hope the
consumption of coal by steam vessels
would be increased to a great extent
and the added cost would not be far
covered by the saving in canal tolls
(\$125 a ton since 1913). Furthermore,
coal at the Atlantic and Indian ocean
ports would be much more than in the
Mediterranean and the Red Sea on ac-
count of the long transportation from
England. Another objectionable feature
of that keeping the depots along the
route adequately supplied would prove
a heavy drain on the British coal
supply, which already are hard pressed
by the task of furnishing fuel not only
to England itself, but to its allies as
well, particularly France.

"It has been suggested that coal from
Asia might be used to substitute for
the English product. No doubt this
could be done, but its poorer quality
would necessitate a larger quantity, and
this would encroach seriously on the
space reserved in the vessels for carry-
ing merchandise. The general effect of
this would be the raising of freight rates
and a curtailment of traffic.
