

The Ulunda left Liverpool on Wednesday, June 29th, and at the outset encountered strong head winds and seas which at times raged with hurricane force so that the ship was badly buffeted. There was practically no diminishing in the force of the weather during the entire voyago. On Wednesday the 6th inst., a violent storm prevailed, and the ship was hove to for eight hours. For the remainder of the passage to St. John's, Newfoundland, dense fog was met and up to noon on Saturday there was no let up. The ship sustained some' little damage about the decks, but nothing serious.


