TIME CHANGES ON C. N. R. LINES

In Effect on September 10, Affecting Trains in and Out of St. John Station—Some Suburban Trains Discontinued.

Time changes on C. N. R. lines effective September 10th affect the schedules of some of the trains in and out of St. John Station and travellers are requested to note the following:

No. 18 local train to Truro, will depart at 7.05 a.m. instead of 7.10 a.m.

No. 14 train for Halifax will leave at 1.40 p.m. instead of 1.00 p.m.

No. 20 train for Moncton (Maritime Express connection), will leave at 6.15 p.m. instead of 6.10 p.m.

No. 10, the night train for Halifax, will leave at 10.45 p.m. instead of 11.05 p.m.

Suburban No. 132 will leave for Hampton at 12.12 noon, and No. 24, the Sussex train, will leave at 5.15 p.m.

No. 9 train from Halifax will arrive at 7.40 a.m.

No. 19 from Moncton (Maritime Express connection), will arrive at 1.55 p.m.

No. 18 will arrive at 8.55 p.m., as usual.

No. 17 local train from Truro will arrive at 8.00 p.m., instead of 8.50 p.m.

No. 183 suburban from Hampton will arrive at 2.40 p.m. The Sussex train, No. 23, will arrive at 8.55 a.m.

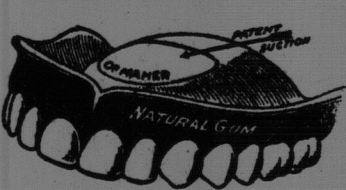
No. 9 train will make all suburban stops between Hampton and St. John, and No. 10 will do the suburban work between St. John and Hampton. All suburban trains other than those above mentioned will be discontinued. The Sunday trains, No. 49 and 50, will make the last trip of the season on Sunday, Sept. 10th.

On the Valley Railway train No. 51 will leave as usual at 4.40 p.m. (Atlantic time), arriving at Fredericton at 8.00 p.m. Through service to Quebec will be on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, as usual, leaving Fredericton at 8.45 p.m. No. 52 train will arrive at 12.55 (Atlantic time).

Service to Prince Edward Island will be by No. 18 train, leaving at 7.05 a.m., and by No. 14 train, leaving at 1.40 p.m. The double daily service to the island will continue until the fall change of time, October 1st. 9-14
