A TERRIBLE TRAGEDY IN THE HOBOKEN ITALIAN QUARTER.

Angelo Caputo kills his Mother-in-law, slays his Wife and Father-in-law, and is shot Dead by His Brother-in-law.—The Two Wounded Persons Likely to Recover.

New York, April 20.—Two dead bodies in Farrow's morgue and two injured persons in St. Mary's Hospital are the result of the bloodiest tragedy that Hoboken has ever known.

Giuseppe Chirichello occupied three rooms there with his wife and son. They had a daughter Antonia, who two years ago married Angelo Caputo.

Caputo had on his person a long-tailed, and a 44-caliber revolver fully loaded. He arose at the night and passed into the room where his wife, child and mother-in-law lay.

Caputo rushed to the kitchen where his father-in-law was. The old man had heard the yell, and rushing at the murderer, threw up his arms and brought it down on Caputo's head with crashing force.

Caputo started for the door. His young brother-in-law then appeared in the kitchen holding his revolver. He fired and his Caputo sprang in the fore-noon.

Caputo was shot in the forehead. The murderer then stepped to the door and fired again.

Caputo's wife, in the hospital. They will recover.

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THIRD EDITION. THE KING OF BELGIUM.

ACCORDS A MOST GRACIOUS RECEPTION TO THE PREMIER OF QUEBEC.

The King Hopes to Visit Canada.—Stunged Good.—Belated.—Canadian.—The Premier Against Sir John.—Quebec Montreal.

Montreal, April 22.—A letter from Hon. Hoboken speaks of the gracious reception accorded him by the King of Belgium who declared himself delighted with the premier's visit and hoped he would prolong his stay, as he wished to speak to him regarding Canada, for which his felt great admiration.

Quercy, April 22.—The steamer schooner Diver has returned to port with over fifteen thousand dollars worth of smuggled whisky captured at Salmon river, Anticosti.

Quebec, April 22.—Contestations in the following federal elections were instituted in the court here yesterday. Delia, for Portneuf; Lanquet for Quebec Centre; Frenois for Quebec county; Choquette for Montmagny; Gray for Levis; Godbout for Beauce; Paris for Montmorency.

At Rimouski, where Sir Adolphe Caron's seat is contested by the liberals, the militia minister lawyers have also made the necessary deposits for a counter petition demanding the personal disqualification of Fiset, the opposition candidate. It is stated that Fiset's friends have taken the necessary steps to demand the personal disqualification of government candidates, Turcotte, in Montmorency, together with the business partner, Prevost, Sir Adolphe Caron, Sir Hector Langevin and Hon. Mr. McGreevy.

Quebec Against Sir John.—Toronto, Ont., April 22.—One of the all-gestions in the petition against the return of Sir John Macdonald charged the premier with securing large contributions from corporations and individuals for the purpose of being used in his own and other elections.
