REPORTS AND DISASTERS.

Hawkesbury, Nov. 29.—Heavy snowstorm last night; northwesterly gale today; schr Abraham Lincoln reported ashore at Long Beach, and schr Minnie at Creusille; schr Shamrock and Hattie C. fouled and drifted down the Strait, Shamrock mast; the other at anchor off Bear Island.

Calais, Me. Nov. 28.—Schr J. Kennedy, which has been reported abandoned at sea, arrived safely today.

New London, Nov. 27.—Schr Gypsum Emperor, from Ingersport, N. S., for New York, before reported ashore.

In Narragansett Bay, has been lost and towed here.

Parabara, N. S., Nov. 24.—A survey on schr Bessie G. from Windsor for Boston, reported damaged here by collision with schr Stella Maud on Sunday, ordered the cargo to be discharged so that a further examination could be made.

### MARINE NOTES

#### WEST INDIA LINE.

West India steamer Oromo, Captain Coffin, went to sea Saturday bound for Bermuda, West Indies, and thence via Halifax with a full freight.

#### MORE HARD COAL.

Schooner Dora C, 402 tons register, in command of Captain Barry, arrived at St. John Saturday, bound for Boston, with 750 tons hard coal for R. P. & W. P. Starr.

#### HERE TO FINISH LOADING.

Donaldson line steamship, Almona, Captain Rankine, arrived in port Sunday, Nov. 25, Saturday with 2,518,000 feet spruce deals shipped at that port by B. L. Tucker. The steamer will finish loading here for the United Kingdom.

#### MANCHESTER LINER ARRIVES.

Steamship Manchester Corporation, Captain Foale, arrived at this port Sunday afternoon direct from Manchester, G. B., with a full cargo for this port and the west. She will discharge at No. 5 wharf.

#### C. P. R. LINERS.

Steamer Montezuma will be due here Wednesday from Antwerp and London. She has a very heavy cargo. Steamer Montreal left Antwerp Nov. 27 for St. John. Empress of Britain is now on her way here from Liverpool due next Friday or Saturday. Large amount of freight for the winter port steamers is coming fast.

#### NOVA SCOTIA SCHOONER SOLD.

The schooner Nicola, formerly owned by Zwicker & Co. of Lunenburg, has been sold to Barbados parties. She has sailed from Liverpool N. S., bound for her southern home, with a cargo of lumber.

#### TWO SCHOONERS ASHORE.

A despatch from Port Hawkesbury says that during the heavy gale on Thursday night the American schooner Abraham Lincoln was driven ashore at Long Branch, and the schooner Minnie is aground at Creusille. The schooner Shamrock and Hattie C. dragged their anchors, fouled, and drifted down the Strait. The Shamrock was towed back with loss of main mast and the Minnie was anchored at Bear Island.

#### RECORD COAL CARGO.

Laden with nearly 11,000 tons of coal, by far the largest cargo of the kind ever brought into port, the new steamer Glace Bay arrived at quarantine about 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon from Sydney, C. B., and will be docked this morning at the Grand Trunk coal piers, where her cargo is to be discharged. The steamer measures 2,350 net tons and is owned by the Glace Bay S. S. Co., Limited, which concern also owns another schooner Minnie in port, and which will be the one now in port and which will probably come here later in the season with a cargo of about 12,000 tons. The Glace Bay was launched only a few months since and has made two or more trips with coal from Sydney to Montreal—Portland Argus, Nov. 30.
