



### SUPREME COURT IN N.S. HEARS ARGUMENT IN MURDER CASES

Haynes Case a Reserved at New Crown Case on Ground of Errors in Trial Judge's Ad-

Halifax, April 17—The supreme court en banco met today to hear arguments in two murder cases, namely the Haynes case of Sydney, and Cook of Sheet Harbor.
