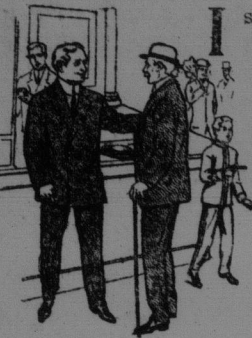

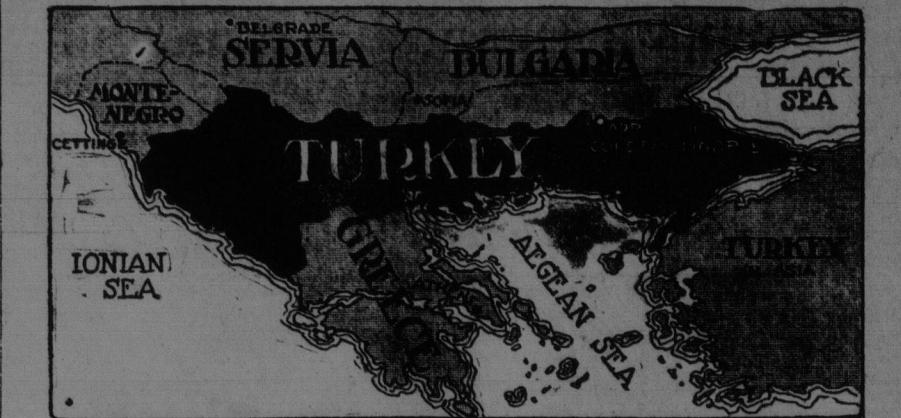

REPORT TERM OF THE DUKE OF CONNAUGHT MAY BE LENGTHENED

Truth Has Rumor that He Will Act as Governor General for Third Year—Swiss Royal Visitors?

London, Oct. 10.—It is almost certain that the Duke of Connaught's term as Governor General of Canada will extend over another year, says Truth, which is generally reliable in such matters. It is very desirable, adds that organ, that he should be at the head of the Canadian government when the Prince of Wales and Prince Albert visit Canada in 1914. The extension of the duke's term will be very popular in Canada. "The Duchess of Connaught and the Princess Patricia are coming in April for a few weeks to England and will visit the Crown Prince and Princess of Sweden at Stockholm. It is considered probable the latter will visit Canada next autumn."
