The penalty provided for violation of the federal law is severe, and may equal a fine not to exceed \$2,000 with or without imprisonment not to exceed 18 months.

Many of the violations described above have been reported and in all such cases where the evidence was sufficient to warrant convictions, prosecutions have been fined and imprisoned ignorance is no excuse for a violation of this kind.
