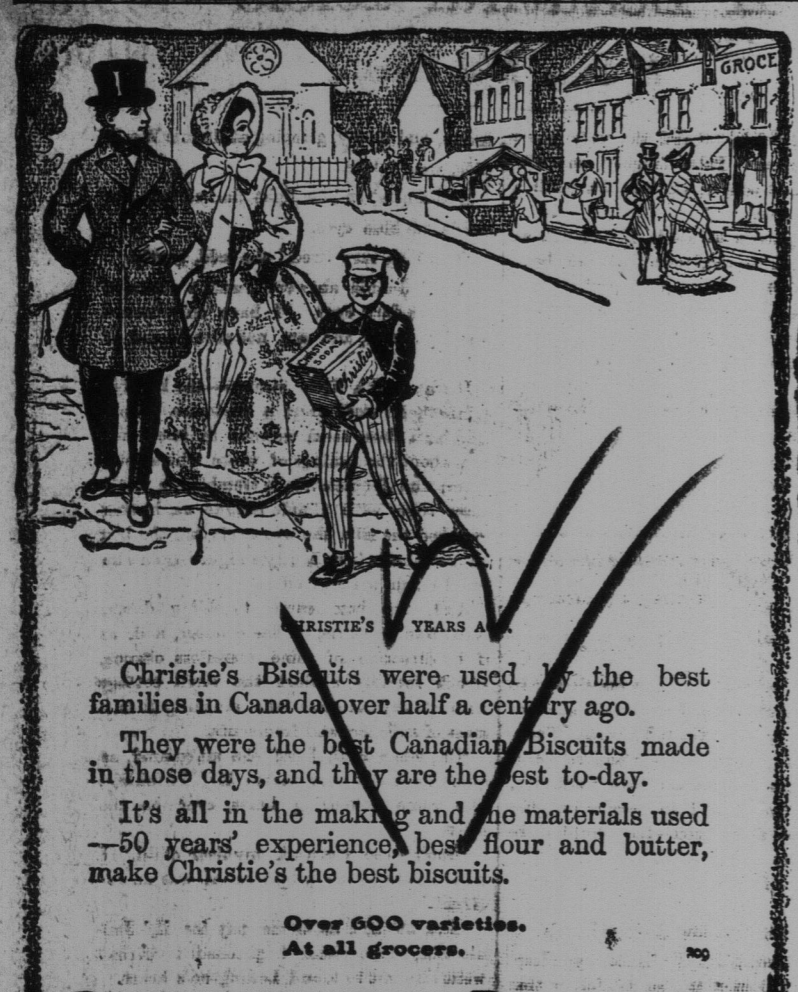

**CENTRAL RAILWAY PLANNING TO MEET BIG BUSINESS BOOM**

Manager Evans Tells of Acquiring of New Rolling Stock. Other Improvements, Also—The Development of the Country Promises Much Business—First Part of This Year Showed Good Results.

R. G. Evans, of Hamilton, manager of the New Brunswick Central Railway, who is at the Royal, says that the recent injury to the bridge at Cole's Island was very slight, and was caused by the lumbermen in that section attaching their beams to the pier of the railway company's bridge; the pressure of logs burst the beam and the bridge pier was moved about seven inches. The damage has since been repaired.

In the past two years all the trestle bridges on the road have been rebuilt, the material used being Southern pine. The company has also strengthened their street bridges and instead of using these with steel structures, Washdenok bridge was the only bridge which had not been rebuilt, but it had been repaired and put in thoroughly safe condition.
