RATES OF ADVERTISING.

The Daily Tribune will receive, when requested, with other City Newspapers in treating all advertising as "transient;" that is, it will regard with favor the abolition of space for advertising by the year. The latter practice has gone out of fashion in all well managed newspapers agents; and being a most unjust arrangement, both for the Newspaper and a majority of the Advertiser, should have ceased to exist in this City many years ago. Such a step might place the Tribune at a disadvantage, for a time, in the race with its older and more vigorous Daily competitors, such as the Telegraph and Journal, Globe, and Morning News; but it would establish a just principle, and, in the end, prove advantageous both to the Advertising Public and the Press. Until a change of the character proposed, however, be consummated, the rates for Advertisements in THE DAILY TRIBUNE will be as follows:—
