The whistle will be sounded six seconds with an intermission of 54 seconds in every minute, and will, pro-ably, be heard from ten of fifteen miles in calm weather, or with the wind, and from 3 to 6 miles during a gale or contrary wind, according to the state of the utmosphere.

The signal will replue the gun, which will hereafter only fire when repairs are being made to the Fog Whistle.
