## GREAT AQUATIC FEATURE AT STAR

ANNETTE KELLARMAN'S NEWEST PICTURE IS ANOTHER GOOD ONE

The big feature "Queen of the Sea" showing this weekend at the Star, is another success for Annette Kellarmann, called "America's perfect woman", and champion swimmer, and incidentally for the Star Theatre, which is showing this feature, also a comedy, and the first instalment of a new serial, at regular prices of admission. The theatre was crowded last night and is likely to have standing room only to-night.

Annette Kellarmann's two other big pictures, "Neptune's Daughter" and "A Daughter of the Gods" have both been seen here. In this new picture "Queen of the Sea" Miss Kellarmann is shown in more underwater swimming, and less fancy diving. In this picture she plays the part of a mermaid in a submarine fairy story designed to display her abilities as a swimmer and high-diver in the most spectacular and sensational style. The picture is full of dramatic sensations, and the fairy story lends itself most aptly to dramatic situations. The photography is charming, and the water scenes and the scenes of the battles in the deep cavern of the King of Storms are particularly good.

Miss Kellarmann is shown in a hair-raising climax where she dives 85 feet from a high wire into the breakers below. This comes as a logical part of the story, where the heroine is escaping from a lofty tower by walking a wire cable across a chasm, when the villain cuts the slender strand, and at the same time the tower is blown up. Miss Kellarmann however is not the only amphibious woman in the feature a number of "storm sirens" doing some fine underwater work. The picture will not disappoint and will be found quite up to the high standard of the other two big pictures by this great aquatic star.

There is also a mirth-compelling comedy, and the new serial "Smashing Barriers" gets off to a good start. William Duncan is the star in this film, and the stunts he pulls off are well worth seeing, whether you care for serials or not. If you like serials you will find it a real live one all the way through, with plenty of thrills and heart interest. It will be seen the first three days of each week.

## EXCELLENT BILL AT IMPERIAL

Exciting situations follow one another rapidly and not for an instant does the interest lag so well worked up is the climax in each case. As is usual in all films there must be a plot and this hinges around the attentions of Cheyenne Harry and the sheriff of the Yucan County who were both in love with the same girl. On the one hand was uprightness while on the other was deception and crookedness and it was not hard to determine who would be the successful suitor. "Ace on the Saddle" is a picture worth while and one that is deserving of a capacity audience. An excellent comedy of the Mack Sennett variety and the 4th Episode of "The Great Gamble" along with an excellent Victory Loan film rounds out a most excellent bill.
