## Generous Giver.

Simla, India, Sept. 7.—Via London.—The Gaekwar of Baroda has contributed five lakhs rupees (\$160,000) to provide aeroplanes for use on the British front. Last December he purchased the Steamship Empress of India as a hospital ship for Indian troops. Soon after the war began he offered all his troops and resources to aid the British.

## Gave Birth to Girl.

London, Sept. 7.—Princess Adalbert, wife of the third son of the German emperor, gave birth to a daughter Saturday. The child died soon after its birth. The condition of the princess is reported to be satisfactory. Prince Adalbert and Princess Adelaide of Saxe-Meiningen were married August 26 1914. Less than a month later the price was reported to have been killed in battle at Brussels, but the rumor proved to have no foundation. In March of this year he was promoted to the rank of captain in the army and major in the navy.

## Campaign Opens.

New York Sept. 7.—A committee appointed by the LaFayette fund, an organization for the relief of soldiers in France, began to-day a campaign to stir up sentiment for the observation of Sept. 9 as an annual LaFayette Day throughout the country. The idea was advanced at the annual meeting of the fund last night and heartily endorsed. A review of the work of the organization since it started last December showed that approximately 50,000 comfort kits, 5,000 ponchos, 10,000 pairs of Arctic overshoes, hundreds of boxes of knitted goods and two field motor ambulances had been sent to France.
