Proviso.

III. And be further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, the Salaries which are now annually allowed and paid to the said Judges shall be secured to them in a fixed and permanent manner: Provided always that no Judge of the Court of King's Bench or Provincial Judge shall hold any other place of profit in the nomination of the Crown.

Retiring Pensons secured to the Judges. IV. And whereas it would be expedient to make Legislative provision to secure retiring pensions to such of the said Judges, as from age or infimities may wish to resign: Be it therefore enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, there shall be allowed to every Judge who shall so resign his office a retiring Pension equal to

he was entitled during the exercise of his functions as a Judge, provided such Judge

years of age at least, and have

exercised the functions of a Judge during

years at least, and that there shall be al-

lowed a retiring pension equal to

of the Salary to which such Judge was entitled while in the exercise of his functions, provided such Judge be years of age at least and have exercised the functions of a Judge during years at least: Provided always that no Judge of the Court of King's Bench or Provincial Judge who shall have obtained a retired Pension, shall hold any place of profit in the nomination of the Crown.

Such Judges not to be deprived from sitting &c. in the Courts where they sat before their retirement. V. Provided also and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that no provision of this Act shall extend to deprive any of the said Judges of the right of sitting and having a deliberative voice in any of the Courts in which before their retirement, they were entitled to sit, if such Judges think fit.

Judges' Salaries and Pensions to be paid out of the funds already appropriated for the administration of Justice.

- VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the Salaries of the said Judges of the Courts of King's Bench in this Province and of the Provincial Judges, and the retiring Pensions hereby fixed and established, shall be taken and paid out of the Funds alreaby by Law appropriated generally for the administration of Justice and the support of the Civil Government.
