

the public, at such fair and equitable terms as may be agreed, until the whole of the shares and interest therein, be purchased and acquired for the public; after which the said Corporation shall expire, and be dissolved, and the said Market-Place and Market House and Stalls, shall thereafter be regulated as, and under the direction of the same persons as the Market-House built and erected in the aforesaid City of Montreal, in virtue of the Act passed in the forty-seventh year of the reign of His Majesty George the Third, chapter the Seventh, is regulated and directed.

Corporation to expire and be dissolved when the whole of the shares shall have been so purchased, on account of the Public.

X. Provided always, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that no penalty or fine to be imposed or levied by any Bye-Law, Rule or Regulation, which shall have been made by the said Corporation, and approved as aforesaid shall exceed the sum of current money of this Province: and that all penalties and fines which shall be incurred under and in virtue of this Act, and of such Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations, shall be sued for and recovered before the Justices of the Peace in their Weekly Sessions: one moiety or half whereof shall go to the Prosecutor or Informer, and the other moiety or half to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, for the public uses of the Province, and towards the support of the government thereof, and the due application of the same shall be accounted for to his Majesty, his heirs and successors, through the Lords commissioners of his Majesty's Treasury for the time being, in such manner and form as his Majesty, his heirs and successors shall be pleased to direct.

Penalties, fines, &c.

How recovered and applied.

XI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all forfeitures, fines and penalties incurred under this Act, and under the Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations which shall so as aforesaid be made by the said Corporation, shall be sued for within next after the offence committed, and not afterwards.

Limitation of Actions.

XII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that nothing herein-contained shall affect or be construed to affect in any manner or way whatsoever, the rights of His Majesty, his heirs or Successors, or of any person or persons whatsoever, or of any bodies politic or corporate, such only excepted as are herein-mentioned.

Saving of the rights of His Majesty, &c.

XIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and as such shall be judicially taken notice of by all Judges, Justices of the Peace, and other persons without being specially pleaded.
