Times for holding Circuit Courts in the different Circles in the District of Montreal-

LI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Circuit Court shall sit in each of the said Circles (Arrondissemens) in the District of Montreal, at the times or terms hereinafter mentioned, that is to say: In the Circle (Arrondissement) of Vaudreuil, from the eighteenth to the twenty-fourth days of January, May and September, inclusively. In the Circle (Arrondissement) of Ottawa, from the first to the fifth days of February and August, inclusively. In the Circle (Arrondissement) of St. Eustache, from the eighth to the sixteenth of February, inclusively, and from the eighteenth to the twenty-sixth days of July and October, inclusively. In the Circle (Arrondissement) of L'Assomption, from the eighteenth to the twenty-sixth of February, inclusively, from the twenty-sixth of May to the fourth of June, inclusively, and from the twenty-sixth of September to the fifth of October, inclusively. In the Circle (Arrondissement) of Richelieu, from the eighteenth to the twenty-sixth of March, inclusively, from the twenty-second to the thirtieth June, inclusively, from the seventh to the fifteenth of October, inclusively. In the Eastern Circle (Arrondissement) from the second to the eighth of January, and from the twentieth to the thirtyfirst of August, inclusively. In the Circle (Arrondissement) of Blairfindie from the tenth to the sixteenth of January, inclusively, from the twenty-eighth of March to the eighth of April, inclusively, and from the twenty-first to the thirtieth days of July and November, inclusively, Sundays and obligatory Holydays always excepted.

The Judges of Civil Coasts to preside on criminal matters.

Jurors in criminal cases not to be called from a greater distance than leagues. LII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all the Judges of the said Civil, Superior and Inferior Courts shall also be Judges of the Courts of King's Bench, established for the administration of Justice in criminal matters, by the said Act of the 34th year of the reign of His late Majesty, Geo. III. Cap. 6.

LIII. And whereas, there may be great difficulty in procuring the attendance of Jurors from the extremity of certain parts of the respective Districts of Quebec, Montreal and Three-Rivers, for the decision of causes in criminal matters; be it therefore further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that the Sheriffs of the said respective Districts, for matters of a criminal nature, shall not be holden to summon and procure the attendance of Jurors from a distance exceeding leagues from each of the said Cities of Quebec, Montreal and Three-Rivers respectively.
