IX. And be it further enacted, That an Act made in the Forty-fourth Year 44 G. 3. c. 29. of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for permitting, until in permitting the Fifth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and five, the Importation tion of lides, of Hides, Calf Skins, Horns, Tallow, and Wool (except Cotton Wool), in etc. further Foreign Ships, on Payment of the like Duties as if imported in British or Irish March 25, Ships; which, by an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, was 1808. revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and fix, and extended to Goat Skins imported in Foreign Ships, shall be, and the fame is hereby revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight.

X. And be it further enacted, That fo much of an Act, made in the so much of Forty-first Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled, An Act for 41 G. a. C. 36. respecting the enabling the Lord Licutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Irc- Exportation land, ta prohibit, for a limited Time, fo as fuch Prohibition shall not endure tom Ireland of Corn or beyond the Expiration of Six Weeks from the Commencement of the next Seffion Potatoes, etc. of Parliament, the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatocs, and of all further conti-Provisions what focuer; and to permit, for such limited Time, the Importation March 25, into Ireland of Corn and Fifh, and all Provisions what foever, without Pay- 1803. ment of Duty ; and for indemnifying fuch Perfons as have acted for the Service of the Publick in advising or carrying into Execution vertain Proclamations of the Lord Licutenant and Council of Ireland, as enables the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, to prohibit the Exportation from Ireland of Corn or Potatoes, and of all Provisions whatfoever, and to permit the Importation into Ireland of Corn and Fifh, and all Provisions whatfoever, without Payment of Duty, which was continued by Four Acts paffed in the Forty-fecond, Forty-third, Forty-fourth, and Forty, fifth Years of His prefent Majefty's Reign, until the Twenty-fifth Day of Murch One thousand eight hundred and fix, shall be, and the fame, is hereby revived and further continued until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eight.

XI. And he it further enacted, That an Act, made in the Parliament Irifh Act of Ircland, in the Twenty-fifth Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, 25 G. 3. reintituled, An Act for granting the Sum of Four thousand Pounds to the Flaxen and Perfons and for the Purpofes therein mentioned; and for continuing an Hempen Ma-Act paffed in this Kingdom in the Third Year of His Majesty's Reign, etc. continued intituled, 'An Act for continuing the Encouragement given by former Acts for 21 Years, 'of Parliament to the Flaxen and Hempen Manufactures,' whereby an additional Duty of One Shilling and Sixpence per Yard, laid by former Acts of the Parliament of Ireland on all White, Painted, and Stained Callicoes, and all Painted and Stained Muslins (except fuch Callicoes or Muflins as were painted and ftained in Great Britain); and an additional Duty of Sixpence per Yard for every Sort of Linen (except of the Manufacture of Great Britain) imported into Ireland, were continued for the Space of Twenty-one Years from the Twenty-fifth Day of March One 3 Q thouland
