All a Conference held at Albany between
his Ex^{ty} William Burnett Esq^r Capt Gen^l & Gov^r
in chief of y^e provinces of New York New Jersey &
& two of the Sachims of the Sennekes named
Kanakaroughton & Tnaninbormwee three Sa-
chims of Cayouge named Ottobekhorce Dehar-
-fere & Ahjelocerat two Sachims of Onondage
named Kackjagorodon & Sadekeeknaghtie this 14th
day of Sep^r 1726.

His Ex^{ty} told them if since they had complain'd againt y^e french in-
-croaching on their land at Oniagara by building a fort there. & since
they Expected y^e the King of Great Britain should protect y^m in the
quiet Enjoyment of their own Lands it would be proper for them to do at
this time what they propos'd to do 25 year ago w^h was to Submit & give
up all their hunting Country to y^e King & to sign a Deed for it w^h how-
-ever has not been done & perhaps for y^e Reason their proposall
at y^e time has not been so well Remembred as it would have been
if they had sign'd such a deed. Therefore his Ex^{ty} ~~therefore~~ pro-
-pos'd y^e they should now sign a deed confirming y^e proposall &
likewise Submitted & giving up all their Land adjoining to y^e lake
of Onseepe & y^e narrow passage between it & y^e lake Cadarochqui &
all y^e Land along y^e lake Cadarochqui 50 Miles from y^e water
of y^e P. Lakes & Rivers Directly into y^e Country so as to Leave
their Castles out of it or sixty miles into y^e Country so as to Include all
their Castles & Country

After a consultation among y^m selves they would rather have y^e said
Deed of Surrender & Submission Include all their Castles & y^e they would
if be pleas'd to Defend y^m from y^e Incroachments of y^e french

His Ex^{ty} told y^m while it is peace his Majesty could use no hard means
ag^t y^e french only to Stand to the treaties Concluded between the
two Nations but in time of war would protect & Defend y^m ag^t all Attempts
& Incroachments whatever to be offered by the french.
