The Right Honourable William Lyon Mackenzie King

Prime Minister of Canada, President of the Privy Council, and Secretary of State for External Affairs.

Honours and Degrees: P.C., C.M.G., M.P.;

M.A. in course (Toronto and Harvard Universities); LL.B. (Toronto); Ph.D. (Harvard); LL.D. (Queen's, Toronto and Harvard); F.R.S.G.; Fellow in Political Economy, University of Chicago, 1896-7; Fellow in Political Science, Harvard University, 1897-00.

Born December 17, 1874, son of John King, K.C.

Organized the Department of Labour in Canada in 1900, and from 1900 to 1908 was Deputy Minister of Labour, and Editor of the Labour Gazette; from 1909 to 1911 was Minister of Labour in the Administration of Sir Wilfrid Laurier.

Member of Parliament for constituency of North Waterloo, Ontario, 1906 - 11; of Prince, P.E.I., 1919 -21; of North York, Ontario, from 1921 to present. ^{Appointed} ~~Opposition~~ Leader of the Liberal Party of Canada as successor of Sir Wilfrid Laurier, at Liberal Convention, August 1919.
