

the crop now growing on the acres
of the land shall remain your
property and be harvested and
taken away by you. If John
Douglas fails to pay the amount
awarded, the land will be leased
and the rent paid to you with
interest until the claim has
been fully satisfied. Failing
to secure a Decree for the land,
you will have the option of paying
Douglas for his improvements also
with interest. The Department
will see that the award is carried
out.
