Dear Mr. Graham:

I have before me your letter of the 8th ultimo, with regard to correspondence between Mr. Inspector Bunn and Mr. Agent Carter with respect to the agent's visits to the reserves in the Fisher River agency. Mr. Carter has submitted a report on this subject to the Department, together with the correspondence between himself and Mr. Bunn in connection therewith.

Mr. Carter represents that if he were to follow Mr. Bunn's suggestion to visit the reserves every week, he would have no time left to attend to the regular work of the agency office. As there seems to be a difference of opinion in connection with this matter, and as it does not seem quite clear to me that the Agent is altogether in the wrong, I would suggest that action be delayed pending a further investigation of the question by yourself. Possibly you will be at the Fisher River
