I am 1923/08 Pte Peterson, Norman of 4th General Transport Royal Canadian Army Service Corps Canadian Army Overseas. About the end of June, or the beginning of July/46, we, here in "B" Platoon in reinforcement of Regiment "G" received a free issue & honoo issue. Some soldiers received a total of 900 cigs & others received 540. I received 900 (300 British Consols 200 Canadian Legion 300 Hentys, 100 sector berries, making a total of 900 in all) having been duly sworn states:-
