Dear Sir:-

I enclose herewith Deed of Land which I have prepared for your signature, deeding Lot 6701 and Lot 6715 to His Majesty the King in the right of the Dominion of Canada as represented by the Minister of Mines and Resources.

With regard to the correspondence which you have had with Major MacKay, the Indian Commissioner for British Columbia, and in particular his letter to you of September 21st, 1939, I would infer therefrom that this Deed is to be prepared by yourself and handed to the Department. Possibly the delay in obtaining the funds is due to a practice of the Department that title must be perfected in their name before funds are provided.

I suggest that you should enclose the Deed to Major MacKay and possibly also a copy of this letter. He might then make arrangements to record the property in the Crowns name either through a Departmental solicitor or he may be good enough to instruct me to do the work.
