His oil paintings are fresh, natural and vivid presentations of the charms of nature. Two of his paintings are in the Permanent Gallery at Liverpool.

### KING, YEEND,

Vice-President of the Royal Society of British Artists, Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors, and the Institute of Painters in Oil Colors. Medallist at the World's Fair, Chicago. Mr. King Is one of the most abic and rising of English artists, and at no distant day there is a strong probability of his being elected an associate of the Royal Academy. A celebrated pleture of his, "From Green to Gold," hangs in the Liverpool Permanent Gailery.

# KNOWLES, G. SHERIDAN.

Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors, the Royal Society of British Artists, the Royal Cambrian Academy of Art. This artist is considered one of the best figure painters exhibiting at the Academy, and his pictures are always reproduced in the official catalogue.
