At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Thursday, the Twenty-first day of January, 1836, in the Sixth Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord WILLIAM the Fourth, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great-Britain and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c. &c. &c. being the Sixth Session of the Fifteenth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

In the time of Sir Colin Campbell, Lieutenant-Governor; Brenton Halliburton, Chief-Justice, and President of the Council; Samuel George William Archibald, Speaker of the Assembly; Sir Rupert D. George, Secretary of the Council; Thomas W. James, Acting Secretary of the Council; and John Whidden, Clerk of Assembly.

TO POD

An Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the service of the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-six, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies granted in this Session of the General Assembly as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province.

(PASSED THE 4th DAY OF APRIL, 1886.)

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

WE, His Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the House of Assembly of His Majesty's Province of Nova-Scotia, towards appropriating the Supplies granted to His Majesty in this Session of the General Assembly, and for supplying the exigencies of His Majesty's Government, do humbly beseech that it may be enacted, and

I. Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Assembly, That, by or out of such Monies as now are, or from time to time shall be or remain in the Public Treasury of this Province, there of Assembly shall be paid the sum of 2001 to the Speaker of the House of Assembly in full for his Salary, as Speaker, during the present year.

And a further sum of 2251 to the Attorney-General, for his services for the present year. And a further sum of 1001 to the Solicitor-General, for his services for the present year.

And a further sum of 600l to the Treasurer of the Province, for his Salary, and as Comptroller General and Auditor of Public Accounts, and in lieu of Office Rent, Clerks and all other contingent expensions.

And a further sum of 1001 to the Clerk of the Council in General Assembly, and as Clerk of His 1001 Clerk of Majesty's Council, for his services in the same year.

And a further sum of 2001 to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, for his services for the same year. And a further sum of 301 for defraying the expenses of Council in General Assembly, for the same Assembly year, to be paid on the Certificate of the President of the Council and not otherwise.

And a further sum of 251 to the Venerable Archdeacon Willis, Doctor in Divinity, for his services of Council Chaplain to His Majesty's Council during the present Session

And a further sum of 25l to the Reverend Fitzgerald Uniacke, for his services as Chaplain to the 25l Rev. F. House of Assembly, during the present Session.

And a further sum of 100/ to the Deputy-Clerk of the Council, for his services for the present Session. 1001 Dy. Clerk And a further sum of 100l to the Assistant Clerk of the House of Assembly, for his services for Council
