A Good Body, a Good Mind and Good Moral Objectives

NEW HEALTH IDEALS

Much interest was argused in an address given in Winnipeg by Dr. Stewart Fraser, chairman of the provincial board of health. There were

three essentials to good citizenship, Dr. Fraser said, a good body, a good mind, and good moral ideals.

Two out of the three requisites had been taken care of by the British people and one essential neglected.

Dr. Fraser outlined the system being followed by the provincial board in sending nurses to the homes and to the schools in order that the children may be reached and through them the mothers.
