It is Understood That the House will Vote in Bulk Supply for Six Weeks.

TARIFF WAR MAY YET BE AVERTED

Editor of Toronto Globe Discusses Question with Political Leaders in the United States

Bulletin Special. Ottawa, Ont., March 17.—Dr. J. A. Macdonald, editor of the Toronto Globe, who arrived here from Washington today and who has discussed the tariff problem with leaders in the government of both countries, is not hopeful of an understanding being reached which will avert the threatened tariff war.

Asked as to the Washington attitude, Dr. Macdonald said: "Anyone who has followed the course of events cannot but be impressed by the opinion in the United States, as represented in the United States, as expressed by leading men in Congress."

During his visit he talked freely with influential men like Senator Aldrich and Senator Lodge, who seem to be representing the "stand pat" element in the Senate, and found them quite anxious in talking with me of the possibility of a tariff war with Canada, and as strongly in favor of improving the trade relations between these two countries as the "progressive" like Senator Dilliver and Senator La Follette.

The same is true of the much-abused speaker of the House of Representatives, Hon. Joseph G. Cannon. All these men are really perplexed and anxious over the present situation.

Among the members of the Conservative side of Commons, although there has been no party caucus, the opinion seems to be that the tariff war would involve serious political consequences to the party in power.

Canada as a whole is interested in avoiding it, and the general opinion seems to still favor the belief that some way may yet be found out of the present deadlock.

A general desire to escape the mutually disastrous consequences of a tariff war, no political suggestion has been made as to any concession Canada might make which would be acceptable to national sentiment.
