## France May Stop Sale of Liquors

Of Absinthe Kind.

Paris, Nov. 9.—Permanent prohibition of the sale of absinthe and kindred alcoholic beverages in France may be a result of the war.

Transportation and sale of absinthe were forbidden when the war began, but the traffic in other intoxicants was continued. The Government has now supplemented its original order with another forbidding the sale of any alcoholic drinks similar to absinthe.

There is a marked movement in all parts of France tending to perpetuate the prohibition.

## To Leave Cracow

Or be Executed.

Paris, Nov. 23.—The military governor of the Austrian fortress of Cracow has published a decree, says a despatch from Rome to the Havas Agency, warning the civilians that if they do not quit the city they will be court-martialed and shot. The decree says:

"As the civil population of Cracow is not obeying with sufficient punctuality the order for the evacuation of the city, the Government warns those who are slow in obeying that they will be court-martialed and that they will suffer the death penalty."

As a result of the ordinance, the despatch adds, approximately 50,000 Poles took immediate flight in all directions.

## Bath Train

Sent for Daily Use of Russian Troops.

London, Nov. 12.—A despatch from Petrograd to Reuter's Telegram Company says:

"The Ministry of Ways and Communications is sending to the front a 'bath train.' The train will be made up of more than twenty cars, which will provide 2,000 baths daily. A tank car will furnish water, if it is not possible to obtain water at any of the stopping places. Another car will be provided for drying and disinfecting outer garments, with ample provision for clean underclothes."


