The Strategy of the East

With the exception of the garrison of Novogorodsk about twenty miles to the north west of Warsaw, the Russians have withdrawn from the line of the Vistula. Petrograd address states that the Russian Army Council decided to leave the garrison there with the object of hampering the German advance. It is situated at the junction of the Vistula, Narew and Wera rivers and is an important railway point. Its retention by the Russian garrison will embarrass the Germans in the use of these rivers and the railway in bringing up supplies. The means of defence open to the Russian garrison are two powerful bridge-heads, eight citadels, protected by eleven strong twelve inch batteries, and massive breastworks. The Russian Staff rely on the garrison holding out for several months against a German siege. It would appear that the Russians have succeeded in saving their army up to the present, and there is every likelihood that the retreat of Grand Duke Nicholas is on the lines of the great retreat of General Joffre. In the latter part of August and the first week of September last, Joffre and French succeeded in frustrating the main strategy of the Germans, which was to cripple France by smashing the French armies. This objective failed and the allies are at least as strong as the Germans on the Western front, with the potentialities of the future largely in their favor. The German General Staff has been attempting on a large scale to do to the Russian army, what they failed eleven months ago to do to the French and British armies, and according to the present situation and make the situation clearer. Should the failure of the German-Austrian strategy be so complete in the East as it was in the West, it definitely marks the collapse of German militarism. The war will reduce itself to one of attrition, until the allies are sufficiently equipped to smash the diminishing strength of the Central Powers.

Fishery Report.

The accompanying report of the fishery at Change Islands for the week ending July 31st, is now posted at the Board of Trade. About 400 or 500 traps, 5 boats, 50 dories and skiffs are fishing. The catch to date is 6,000 qts., with 1,000 for last week. The fishery has arrived from the Treaty Shore with 150 qts. Prospects are looking poor just now, but there is a hope for fair trapping yet. Wornell, though the fish has not yet left the traps. Caplin has gone, but there is plenty of herring for bait. The lob-catch has been poor. On Monday and Tuesday there was good trapping but since then very little was best hit traps or hook and line. The while there have about 100 qts. doing a few two have 300. A few are on the outside grounds yet.

Good Whale Fishery.

According to latest reports the whaler Cachet, Capt. Amundsen, operating at Hawke's Harbor, has captured 28 whales to date. The whales are said to be smaller than those captured last year. At this date last year the Cachet had only 6 whales landed and at the close of the voyage had 56 to her credit. With the most favorable part of the season yet to come this year's catch is expected to be a record one.
