James Malcolm, who was chairman of the special committee of the House in regard to the Civil Service Superannuation Bill, explained its general features yesterday previous to its passing the committee stage of the House. It would apply, he said, to all permanent employees in receipt of \$600 or over, and also to those classed as temporary but who really were make a contribution of 5 per cent. of his salary. Retirement would be optional at 65 and compulsory at 70.
