TEACHERS GETTING HIGHER SALARIES

Pedagogues in West Middlesex Are Better Paid Than Heretofore.

At the meeting of the county council yesterday afternoon, Inspector Johnson, of West Middlesex, presented his annual report on the state of the public schools in his division.

The report contains a great deal of useful and interesting information, and shows that the schools are in a very satisfactory state. The financial statement shows that the receipts were \$70,575 21, and the disbursements \$57,331 80. The disbursements show an increase of \$3,-430 92, due chiefly to higher salaries paid teachers, the increased cost of the control of the fuel, janitor work and libraries. The balance carried over shows an increase of \$43 17.

hirty-eight pupils were enrolled in schools, classified as follows: In Part I., 868; in Part II., 632; in the second 772, in the third 1,005, in the ourth 922, in the fifth 239. The next part of the report deals it some length with the new programme of studies for the public schools, reference being made to new features. The report concludes by recommending teachers to avail themselves of the privileges of attending the summer schools, where special training is given for teach-

ing nature study, art and constructriculum and the higher standard now i vided. required for passing the high school entrance examination, the inspector is of opinion that one effect will be s of opinion that one effect will be o keep the pupils longer at the public schools than formerly.

A reference is made to the in-

creased attention now required to be given to supplementary reading in the various classes. The necessity of school libraries is pointed out to furnish the pupils with the books needed for this purpose. A brief reference is made in concluding paragraphs to the Model School, promotion examinations, the Teachers' Institute, etc. Taken as a whole the report is very comprehens-
