DEDICATED BY THE BISHOP

Formal Opening of St. Paul's Church, Stratford, by Bishop Williams.

St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Strat- ford, was formally opened on Sunday. His Lordship the Bishop of Huron, as- sisted by Rev. Messrs. Asbury, of Mit- cheil, Dean Davis, of London, and Deacon, of Stratford, took part in the service.

The new church, which will be occu- pied by the congregation of the Home Memorial Church, has been erected at a cost of \$10,000. It is built of cement blocks, with the appearance of stone.

The auditorium is 45 by 55 feet, with a seating capacity of about 400. A two- manual organ has also been installed.

Altogether, the building is a creditable addition to the church edifices of the city.

The parish was the outcome of chapel service and Sunday school, under the direction of Rev. E. Pat- erson, M.A., at that time rector of St. James' Church. In the year 1876 that it was erected into a separate parish, and provided with a grant from the mission funds of the diocese. Rev. J. P. Cowie was appointed the first rector, and he continued in that work until the year 1882. Rev. D. Deacon, who was then appointed rector, which po- sition he has held up to the present time. For many years the parish has been independent of outside assistance, but up to the present year work has been carried on under great disadvan- tages.

A goodly number of devoted men and women, appreciating the great difficulties which hampered the work in many ways, inaugurated a move- ment for the building of a new church in a more convenient and suitable place.

The late Judge Lizar, who had donated the lot on which the church was erected, and the name "Home Memorial" was given it as a memorial to his deceased son.

With commendable zeal and energy members of the church labored now stands as a monument of their labors.

The parish has hitherto been known as the Home Memorial Church. For some time a change in the name of the church seemed to be desirable, and for this reason it has been renamed St. Paul's.
