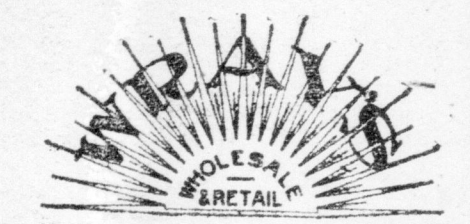

SELECT SITE FOR CHURCH

King St. Presbyterians Decide To Build at the Corner of Lyle and Dundas.

EDIFICE TO COST \$25,000

The King Street Presbyterian Church congregation without a dissenting voice Monday night decided to build on the lot they already have purchased on the corner of Lyle and Dundas streets. The cost of the new building exclusive of a Sunday school, will be apportioned in the following manner:
King Street congregation \$10,000
Outside subscriptions 5,000
Debt 10,000
Total \$25,000

The Presbyterian Council met in the King Street Church on Monday evening to select a site for the new church which the congregation for some time has contemplated building. The committee in charge of the project reported in favor of the corner of English and Dundas streets instead of the site already purchased at the corner of Lyle and Dundas. The council favored the sale of the present church lot, on which a profit of about \$1,000 can be realized. A discussion on the merits of various sites was held.

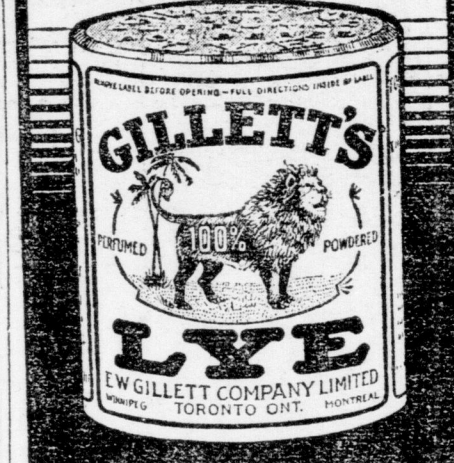

They contend that the matter has never been brought before the Journeyman Barbers' Union, and that until that body decides the price of shaves must be 15 cents, they are not bound to charge that price.

Canadians in the Front Rank

Although Canadians feel a just and growing pride in being called the fairest flower that Britain possesses, yet how few of us are aware of the vast importance that Canada already holds on the map of the world. Mr. Vreeman, who is identified with a number of the largest business enterprises in the old land, and whose duty it is to study and report on the development and financial aspect of the different trade routes of the world, has recently been through Canada on a tour of inspection, says that as a commercial port, London will always hold first place, New York second from the advantage of its position as an Atlantic port, and as a Pacific coast port, along the peoples of the globe, Vancouver, with its unique distinction of being the largest of fresh water ports for ocean-going vessels to enter, and its immense natural resources, manufacturing, agricultural, outlook, railway facilities (no less than eight continental roads all heading for British Columbia), waterpowers, and the advantage of being so near the Panama Canal, must soon rise to third place as a world city, which position she will undoubtedly maintain for all time. When Old Vancouver, South Vancouver, New Westminster, Burnaby, Port Moody, Point Grey and Port Coquitlam are incorporated into Greater Vancouver, she will have a population about three-fourths as large as Toronto, with about half the territorial area. Coquitlam, having the advantages of level lands, affords superior advantages for great industrial enterprises, a large number of which are already located there, in addition to the great C. E. R. terminals and shops, which they purpose will be the finest of their kind on the continent. Any investments here cannot fail to be interesting to the investor, as Vancouver in a very few years will no doubt overstep the million mark, and will still be in its infancy.

COUNCIL DECIDES ON IMPROVEMENTS

Greater Part of City Engineer Ashplant's Report Was Passed.

SHELTER FOR DRAYMEN

Will Be Provided With Building South of Tracks, But Must Pay for a Telephone Themselves.

The city council on Monday night passed the greater part of the city engineer's report on local improvements, the discussion of the report being the chief consideration of the council session. Sidewalks in the new districts, on streets which have not yet been properly graded, will be further considered by the board of works before the council will authorize their construction.

Among the improvements which will be gone ahead with are:
A vitrified brick pavement on Horton street, from Ridout to Talbot, to cost \$3,200.
An asphalt pavement on the same street from Talbot to Wellington, to cost \$11,750.
A concrete curb on both sides of Horton street, from Talbot to Wellington, to cost \$1,305.

Gravel Roadways.
Gravel roadways will be laid on Eva street from Dundas to Florence, to cost \$2,036; on Florence street, from Egerton to the Interlocking tracks to cost \$2,837; on Laura street, between the same limits, to cost \$2,426.
Curbs will be laid on Colborne street from Queen's avenue to Dundas street, on Westmorland street, from Oxford to Cambridge; on Riverview avenue, from Wharncliffe west; on Tecumseh avenue, 400 feet west from High; on Mary street, 350 feet east of Egerton; on Bridges street, from Egerton to Gore; on Adelaide street, from Smith to Oliver; on Nelson street, from Clarence to Wellington; on Sherwood avenue, west of Richmond.

cess avenue, Charlotte street and Dorinda street, in the new annexed district, was referred back to No. 2 committee on the objection of Ald. Moore. He pointed out that these streets are in the new surveys and should be graded and gravelled for traffic before being accepted by the city. The construction of sidewalks, he claimed, would be a virtual taking over of the roadway.
An additional sanitary sewer will be constructed on Dundas street east from the old city limits to Ashland avenue, although there is already a sewer extending to the Dominion abattoir plant.
Lorne avenue will be opened up from the old city limits and Charlotte street, the council paying \$250 of the cost and the remainder being assessed against the property benefited.
