

SHELTER FOR DRAYMEN

The city council on Monday night passed the greater part of the city engineer's report on local improvements, the discussion of the report being the chief consideration of the council session. Sidewalks in the new districts, on streets which have not yet been properly graded, will be further consider by the board of works before the council will authorize their construc-

Among the improvements which will be gone ahead with are: A vitrified brick pavement on Horton street, from Ridout to Talbot, to

cost \$3,300. An asphalt pavement on the same street from Talbot to Wellington, to cast \$11,781.

Gravel Roadways.

A concrete curb on both sides of Horton street, from Talbot to Wellingon, to case \$1,305.

Gravel roadways will be laid on Eva street from Dundas to Florence, to cost \$2,036; on Florence street, from Egerton to the interswitching tracks to cose \$2,837; on Laura street, between the same limits, to cost \$2,426.

Curbs will be laid on Colborne stree from Queen's avenue to Dundas street, nd on Adelaide street from Ada to Terrace street in Chelsea Green.

Cement walks will be laid on Dundas street, from old city limits to the interswitching tracks; on Westmorland street, from Oxford to Cambridge; on Riverview avenue, from Wharncliffe west; on Tecumseh avenue, 400 feet west from High; on Mary street, 350 feet east of Egerton; on Brydges street, from Egerton to Gore; on Adelaide street, from Ada to Terrace; on May street, from Smith to Oliver; on Nelson street, from Clarence to Wellington; on Sherwood avenue, west of
