

C." in 1872. Ross was expelled for subordination. The connection between the supreme council and the "V. C." was ruptured in 1884, each claiming to be the legitimate organization. Mr. Parmelee the witness said, requested him to write to Devoy, Sullivan, Hines and Carroll a letter written by Devoy from New Haven in 1881, to witness. Devoy wrote: "I cannot tolerate the kind of thing being done in Buffalo." According to the witness this referred to the attempt of the Parnellites to disrupt the revolutionary organization, and had no reference to protests against violence and crime.
